We've Got the Power! Presentation on the Power of Age

Hartford, Connecticut (April 29, 2013) — The Hartford History Center will kick off National Older Americans Month on Saturday, May 11, with a special presentation called "Unleashing the Power of Age" with Dr. Louise E. Loomis.

Presented from 10:30 a.m. until noon in the Hartford History Center on the third floor of Hartford Public Library's Downtown Branch, Dr. Loomis' lively presentation will emphasize the storehouse of wisdom older men and women possess, and how to use this accumulated knowledge to enhance self-esteem, the lives of others, and to influence decision makers. She will also discuss new research on the brain and using the natural skills acquired through age to solve problems, think creatively and unleash one's power.

A graduate of Bryn Mawr College, Dr. Loomis also holds a master's degree in Urban Education from the University of Hartford and a doctorate in Creative Education from the University of Massachusetts. Originally a science teacher at the high school level, she founded the New England Cognitive Center in 1989, and began a new career working with college students. She taught for more than 20 years at Hartford College for Women, at the University of Hartford and at Goodwin College. Now retired from formal teaching, Dr. Loomis serves as a mentor, teacher and curriculum developer at ThinkWell Center LLC, which she founded in 2011.

The ThinkWell Center offers programs designed to sharpen thinking and creativity for people of all ages. Dr. Loomis has presented papers at many conferences, and her writings include books, articles, and newsletters.
