

The World's Strongest Librarian Coming to Hartford Public Library!



Hartford, Connecticut (July 3, 2013) — Hartford Public Library is proud to announce an event featuring Josh Hanagarne, author *THE WORLD'S STRONGEST LIBRARIAN: A Memoir of Tourette's, Faith, Strength, and the Power of Family*, on Wednesday, July 17 at 5:30 p.m. in the *Center for Contemporary Culture* at the Downtown Library, 500 Main Street. This program is part of Hartford Public Library's Adult Summer Reading Program and is presented in collaboration with The Mark Twain House & Museum.

Josh Hanagarne is a 6'7" giant known as the World's Strongest Librarian. A librarian at the Salt Lake City Public Library, he battles his

own case of Tourette Syndrome and became a strongman weight-trainer to better manage his symptoms. He believes in curiosity, questions, strength, and that things are never so bad they can't improve. Josh's popular blog, <u>World's Strongest Librarian</u>, currently gets more than 80,000 visitors each month. At Hartford Public Library, he will share his inspiring and utterly unique story about his life-long struggle with Tourette's, his family, faith, and journey into weight-lifting.

The Mark Twain House & Museum's Jacques Lamarre states, "When I heard about Josh Hanagarne's amazing memoir, I knew we had to bring him to Hartford. The fact that he loves books, cites Mark Twain as one of his favorite authors, and is a librarian makes Josh's appearance the perfect event for Hartford Public Library and The Mark Twain House & Museum to co-present. I hope people from throughout the region will come see a man who can make sense of the Dewey Decimal System AND lift a boulder over his head."

Matt Poland, the Library's chief executive officer, noted that Mr. Hanagarne's experience is "a life lesson in perseverance no matter the odds."
