Hartford, Connecticut (November 9, 2011) – Hartford Public Library announced today that it will offer eBooks to its customers, free of charge. Library card holders will be able to browse the library's website and download this digital media anytime, anywhere, by visiting <a href="http://hplct.lib.overdrive.com">http://hplct.lib.overdrive.com</a>.

Customers may download eBooks to PC, Mac®, and many mobile devices. Some devices require Adobe Digital Editions free software to read eBooks, which can be easily and quickly downloaded. Titles can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including Mac and Windows operating systems, the Kindle, NOOK, iPod, iPad, iPhone, Blackberry, Android, Sony Reader and others. Kindles do not require downloading software, instead customers search for "Kindle Book," check out a title with a valid library card, and then click "Get for Kindle."

"We are excited about adding eBooks to our collections as a way to encourage reading in the digital age," said Matthew K. Poland, chief executive officer at Hartford Public Library. "Whether you read a traditional book or one formatted for your iPad, you are reading and that's the bottom line."

Best-selling and classic titles that satisfy many interests will be available anytime. eBooks automatically expire at the end of the lending period, so there are no late fees! This new service, powered by OverDrive, is free for customers with their library card.
