## Hartford Public Library Celebrates Newly Renovated Dwight Branch with Ribbon Cutting

Hartford, Connecticut (December 5, 2012) – Hartford Public Library celebrated the opening of its newly renovated Dwight Branch Monday, December 3, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. The Dwight Branch, established in 1907 in the neighborhood, is located at a busy intersection in the heart of the Parkville, where it connects to the Parkville Elementary School and the Parkville Senior Center. The expanded branch will increase its capacity to 2,200 square feet, allowing the Library to increase its scope of programs and services.
