STEP 4: Once <u>YOU</u> have collected <u>ALL</u> necessary documents, the Screener will make an appointment for you with a Legal Representative.

Minimum requirements; you must be:

1) 18 years of age or older

2) A U.S. Legal Permanent Resident (Green Card holder) for 5 years or more. *Exception: Marriage to a US citizen requires 3 years of U.S. residency*

3) Speak, read, write, and understand basic English. Applicants age 50 and over could be excused from the English literacy requirement.

The legal representative may need additional information or documents before reaching a decision on a client's eligibility. Upon deciding your eligibility we anticipate completing and submitting your application within 4 weeks.
