Did You Know? The equestrian statue of Revolutionary War General Marquis de Lafayette at the corner of Capitol Avenue and Washington Street includes a turtle underneath Lafayette's horse. Why the sculptor put it there remains a mystery. The most common explanation is that he included it to symbolize how slowly he was paid!

The Camp Field Library, 30 Campfield Avenue will be closed from Aug. 27 - 31 so that workers can install a new floor.




