Did You Know? The famous Charter Oak tree fell during a storm on August 21, 1856. The tree, which was 700-600 years old, was located near the corner of Wyllys and Prospect Streets. A modest monument marks the site. In addition to numerous businesses and organizations being named in its honor, there are also two towns: Charter Oak, Iowa (Pop. 502; 2010 census) and Charter Oak, California (pop. 9,310; 2010 census).



the book, Ellie and Claudia Hart, stopped by to thank the author and listen as she read passages from her book.




