Did You Know? In 1855, Hartford became the first city to use galvanized pipes for water distribution. The new pipes had been developed by A.P. Pitkin, a pipe dealer in Hartford who was worried about people getting lead poisoning from the old-style pipes.




Hartford Athletic Hosts Pizza Party for YOUmedia teens




