HARTFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY'S BABY GRAND JAZZ KICKS OFF THIS SUNDAY, JANUARY 5

Baby Grand Jazz returns with support from The Kaman Foundation

(HARTFORD, CT) – Hartford Public Library's (HPL) popular Baby Grand Jazz Series (BGJ) will return for its 21st season on January 5, 2025.

The free series, supported by a generous three-year sponsorship from The Kaman Foundation, features accomplished jazz musicians and bands from around the region. HPL will continue to host the Baby Grand Jazz series on Sunday afternoons at 3:00 p.m. from January to April, excluding Easter Sunday on April 20. The concerts will take place in the Center for Contemporary Culture (CCC) at HPL's Downtown Library, 500 Main Street, Hartford.



The Kaman Foundation has been funding Baby Grand Jazz since 2015. Their sponsorship will support the successful concert series and ensure its continued growth, fostering a love and appreciation for modern America's original art form, Jazz.

Concerts start this Sunday, January 5, at 3:00 p.m., and doors open at 2:00 p.m.

January 5 – Chloe Madrak Quartet: Chloe Madrak is a 17-year-old tenor saxophonist from West Hartford, Connecticut. In addition to being a member of Hall High School's Concert Jazz Band, she is also a member of Jazz at Lincoln Center Youth Orchestra in New York City. She has performed at the Monterey Jazz Festival with the Next Generation Jazz Orchestra. She has received awards throughout her high school career, including Outstanding Clarinet Soloist & Woodwind Doubler awards from the Essentially Ellington Festival, Outstanding Soloist Award from the Charles Mingus Competition, and was named a YoungArts Winner in 2024.

January 12 – MNM Trio with Josh Bruneau: Mary DiPaola began her musical career at the Hartt School, where she received degrees in piano performance and jazz studies under the direction of the legendary



Jackie McLean and a degree in music education. She has been performing music throughout CT since, appearing in Litchfield and Hartford Jazz festivals. She has recorded three times as a bandleader: *Cat's Cradle, Seventh Sign*, and the most recent, *Grata*. DiPaola has worked consistently with bassist Nat Reeves since the 1990s, and their collaboration now includes Molly Sayles on drums. The trio released *Grata* in June of 2024 and has appeared at the Side Door Jazz Club, The Red Door Jazz series, and the Paul Brown Monday Night Jazz series. The MNM trio will be joined by trumpeter Josh Bruneau, who has appeared with the group several times, including the Parkville Monday Night jazz series, the Paul Brown series in Bushnell Park, and the Jazz at the Red Door series.

January 19 – Charlie Apicella & Alexis Marcelo "The Inner Teachings of Yusef Lateef": Charlie Apicella and Alexis Marcelo pay tribute to their mentor, Yusef Lateef. Selections include Apicella's originals, spontaneous group improvisation, and never-before-performed compositions by Lateef from such collections as Flute Book of the Blues and The Repository of Scales and Melodic Patterns.

January 26 – Michelle Tucker Quintet + Strings: Michelle Tucker is a percussionist, composer, and music educator living in the woods of Massachusetts with her two children. Michelle grew up playing in Boston's DIY punk scene and is an alumna of The Berklee College of Music (BM '13) and The Longy School of Music's Modern American Music program (MM '17). She was part of the first cohort of the Broadway Musicians Equity Partnership during the Fall of 2023, where she shadowed the Broadway production of Six. Michelle has released two singles with The Michelle Tucker Quintet, Both Can Be True and Leapin', and she premiered a piece for a jazz quartet and orchestra titled Pieces of Home at The Berklee Performance Center in September 2024. Michelle is a transgender woman and feels it is essential to be visible with the hope that her leading a life in music openly will contribute to the normalization of trans identities
