Hartford Public Library Announces 2019 Line-up for Baby Grand Jazz Series

Ray Gonzalez to Open Series with Special Three Kings Day Performance

(HARTFORD, CT, December 4, 2018) Hartford Public Library (HPL) will blow away the post-holiday blues as the highly-popular Baby Grand Jazz Series returns for its 16^{th} season starting Sunday, January 6. Baby Grand Jazz performances will be held every Sunday this year through April 28, with the exception of Easter (April 21), from 3-4 pm (doors open at 2 pm).

The opening show will be a special Three Kings Day performance by local salsa and Latin jazz master Ray Gonzalez and his quartet. The show will be held in the atrium of the Downtown Library, 500 Main Street, Hartford. All other shows will be held in the Downtown Library's Center for Contemporary Culture (Main Floor) with the exception of the final show, Giacomo Gates, on April 28.
