Brown Rudnick Charitable Foundation Continues to Support Hartford Public Library's Early Literacy Initiative

Hartford, **July 18, 2016** — Hartford, CT July 18, 2016 - Hartford Public Library's Leap into Learning's receives a \$10,000 grant Phase Two funding from the Brown Rudnick Charitable Foundation.

Since September 2015, Hartford Public Library and its Leap Into Learning—Child Care Program has worked with 24 licensed and unlicensed Home-Based Child Care Providers to increase their knowledge of child development, early childhood curriculums, and the most current brain development research to ensure they offer high-quality care to their young learners. Through a series of in-home visits, hands-on training workshops, and material resources library staff have helped build their knowledge and skills in the five key domains: social competence, emotional maturity, physical health and well-being, language and cognitive development, and communications skills and general knowledge.

As word about our program has spread, we now have a waiting list of providers who want to be included in the next cycle of training. At the same time, the providers we are currently working with express how much the parents of their charges need to be educated about the importance of learning in the early years. This is the reason for the creation of Phase Two of Leap Into Learning—Providers Teaching Parents. The goal is to educate parents about the skills their children need to be ready for kindergarten and how they can provide opportunities for their children to grow in each of the five key domains.

This second phase focuses on the parents of children our current cohort of cares for. Ten providers will work in pairs with library staff assistance to conduct "Parent Education Parties" five times in the course of one year. These providers will pass on the knowledge they have gained in Phase One of Leap Into Learning to the parents of the children they care for.
