Hartford's L.I.T. Receives Grant To Continue Bringing Writing Workshops to Community

Hartford Public Library, in partnership with Hartford's L.I.T, and Every Kinda Lady Co., received a \$25,000 grant from the Cornelia T. Bailey Foundation to fund a Literary Art Wellness Retreat and other literary programming as part of a new project to support women in the Greater Hartford area in writing and publishing their own narratives.

Workshops for adults and teens will be held throughout the winter and spring of 2023, as well as a weekend writing retreat and a two-day conference that will invite publishers, literary agents and guest speakers and include a keynote author.


Mixed Company






We're proud to play a part in helping to launch Hartford Black Heroes Trail celebrating Black History Month. The installation along Main Street highlights 19 impactful heroes who made history locally and nationally, and is an extension of the Hartford History Center's Changemakers series. The Library's Dr. Shaw is one of the 19 Black Heroes on the trail.

Born in Hartford in 1917, Dr. Shaw was among the first African American librarians to integrate the professional ranks of the Hartford Public Library. He served as Branch Manager of the Upper Albany Branch of the Hartford Public Library from 1941-1949 becoming the first African American librarian to ever be hired by the library system.
