

Instructional Design Coordinator – Full Time

Part of The American Place Division, the **Instructional Design Coordinator** is responsible for developing and implementing instructional design using the most advanced technology available to facilitate optimal learning for students on-ground and remote. The incumbent must have a strong mastery of a variety of educational technologies, including Learning Management Systems, Content Management Systems, online collaboration technologies, and Microsoft productivity tools. The successful candidate must possess strong interpersonal skills working with learners from diverse economic, educational, and cultural backgrounds. The incumbent interfaces regularly with the Division's educational staff to ensure successful implementation and usage of current educational technologies.

RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

Development

- Utilizing an LMS, develop level appropriate courses and integrate training resources offering a central ADA compliant virtual hub for e-Learner access.
- Review and recommend level appropriate educational technologies in the area of Adult Education and Workforce Development.
- Maintain a thorough and up-to-date knowledge in the area of educational technology and instructional design.

Collaboration & Instruction

- Facilitate collaboration and trainings across the library system in the use of educational technologies for their customers.
- Serve as lead for blended learning instruction and digital literacy across all TAP educational offerings.
- Train instructors on the use of educational technologies by students.
- Train instructors on the use of the technologies' administrative portals to effectively track and analyze student progress.
- Develop user instructional guides/videos
- Serve as a resource person and internal consultant in the planning and implementation of emerging educational technologies.

Administration

- Collect and analyze e-Learning program data for the purpose of compiling monthly output and outcome reports.
- Maintain electronic records of site licenses, agreements, and passwords.

- Manage online educational assessments and exams, including GED and CASAS.
- Train and supervise technology coaches, support specialists and instructors.
- Identify related grants and assist with the development of grant proposals.
- Other duties as assigned.

- Master's in Education, preferably in Instructional Design or Educational Technology.
- (Candidates with a Bachelor's Degree in Education and at least 5 years' experience in the educational technology field will be considered)
- Demonstrated experience working with multimedia applications, web design, digital content distribution, online collaboration software, chat rooms and message boards, content repositories, online information storage and retrieval.
- Demonstrated experience with Microsoft Windows desktop computing environments/productivity software.
- Strong communication skills working with diverse communities.
- Demonstrated experience working in a not-for-profit educational setting.
- Possess strong data management and data analysis skills.
- Bilingual Spanish/English preferred.
