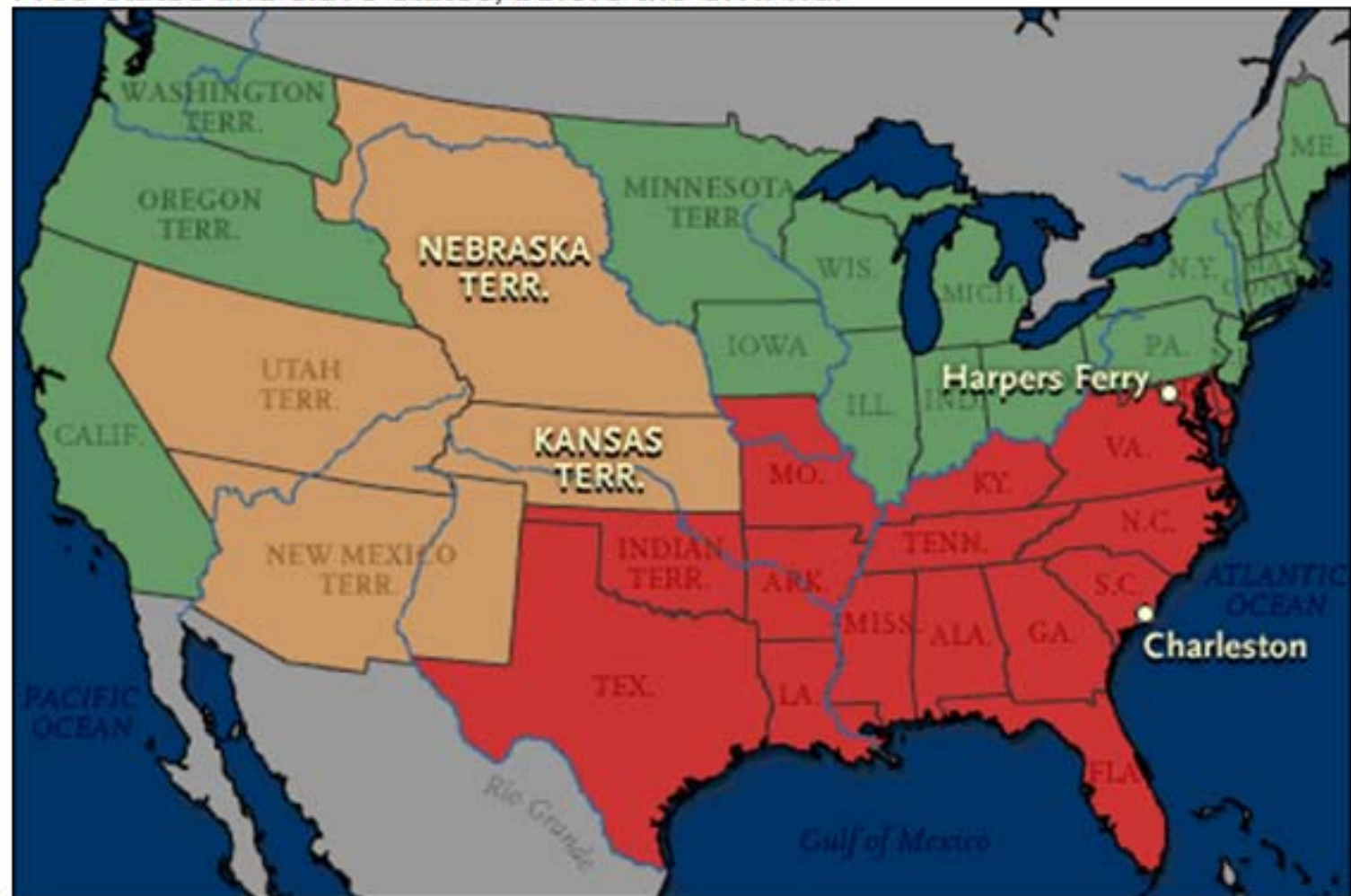

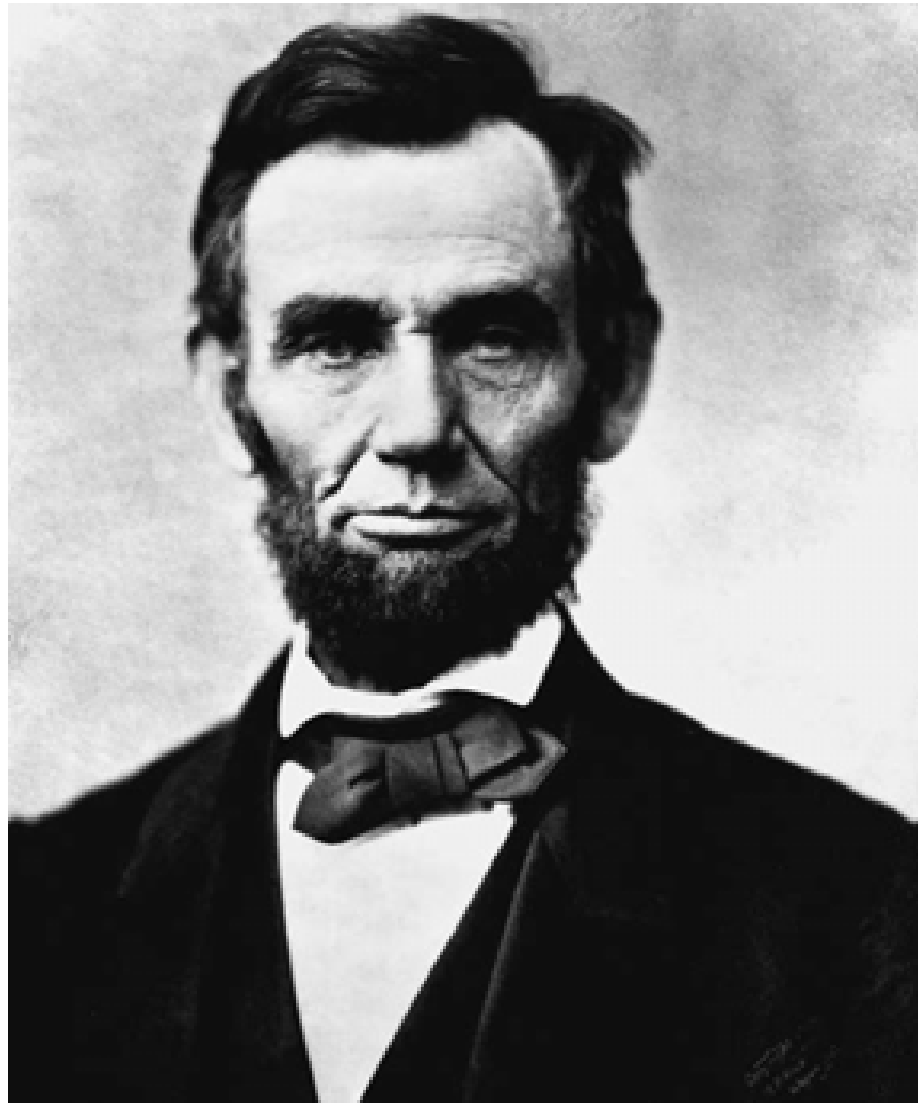

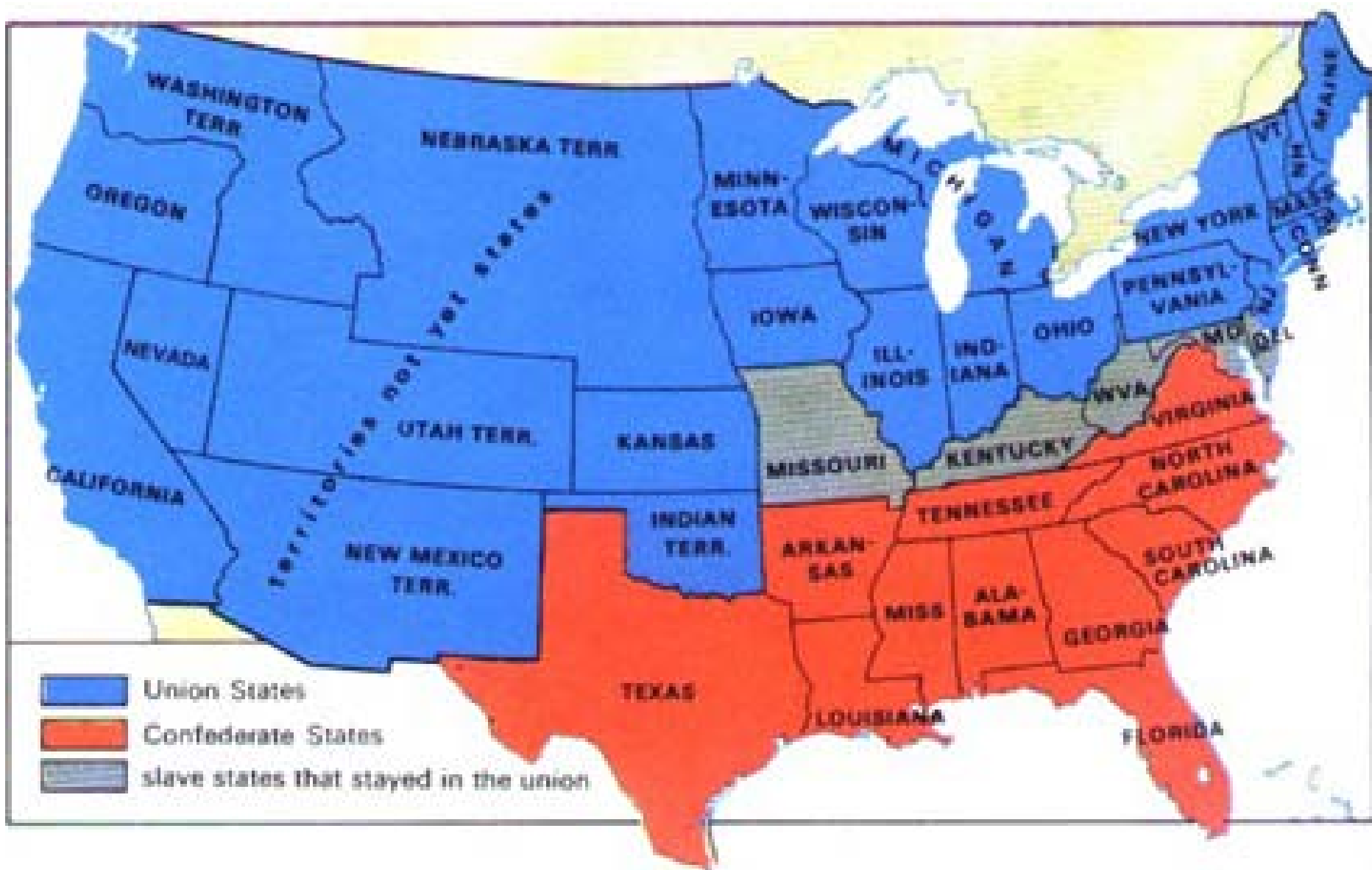

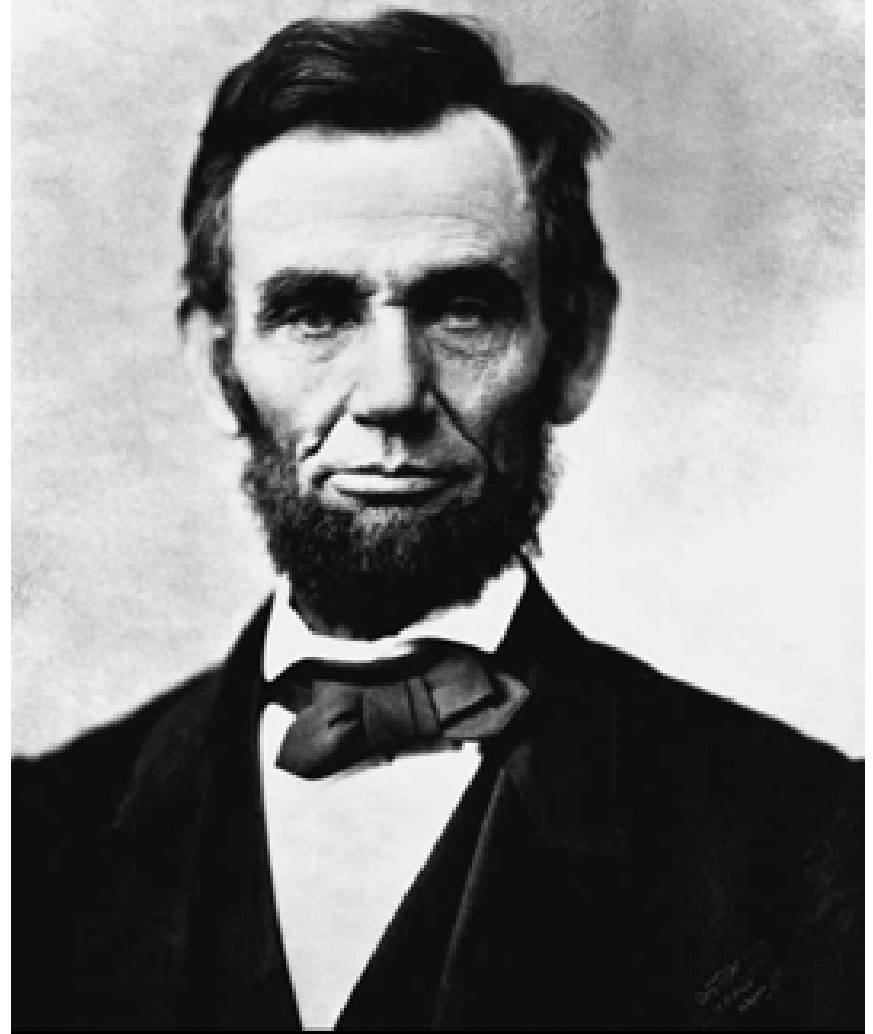
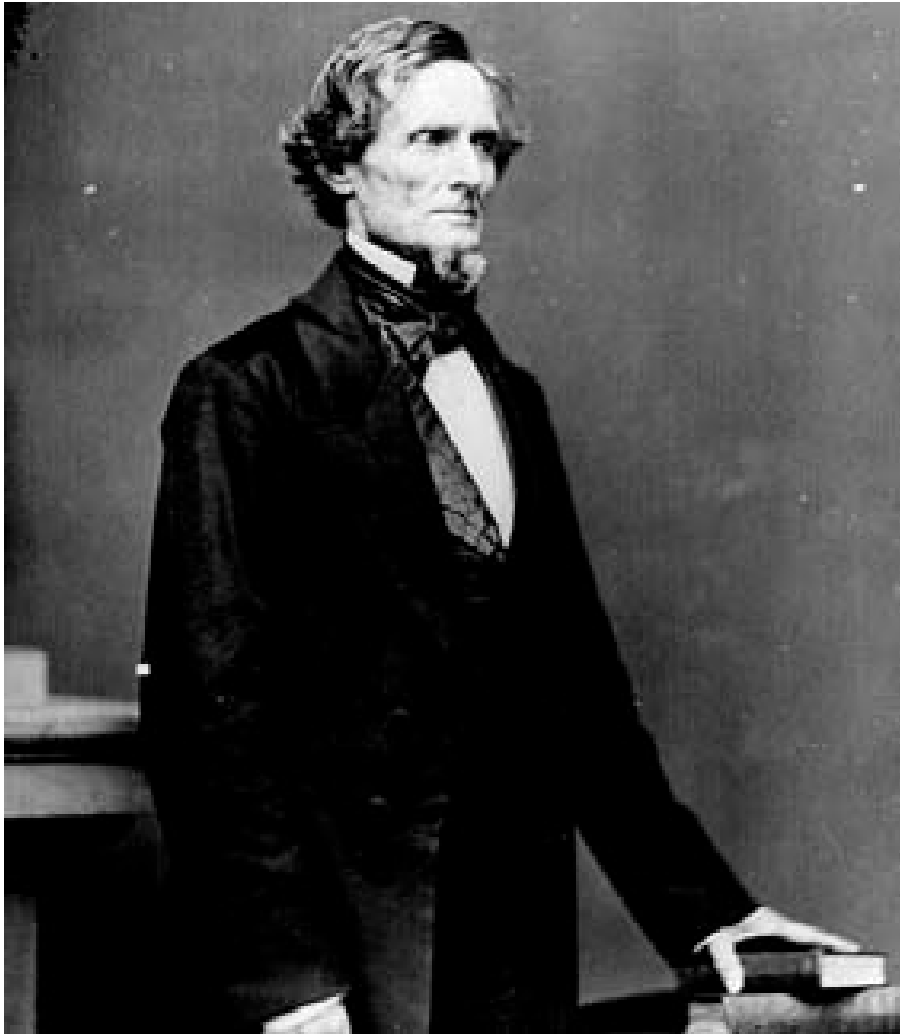


President Abraham Lincoln - 1861





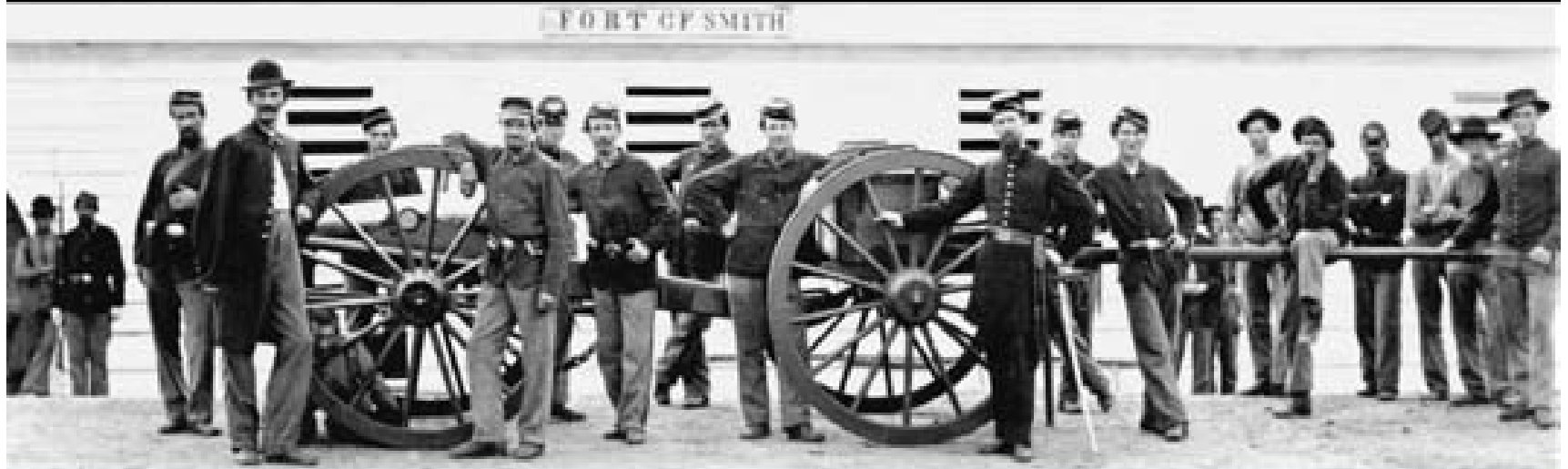
The 2 Presidents of the United States

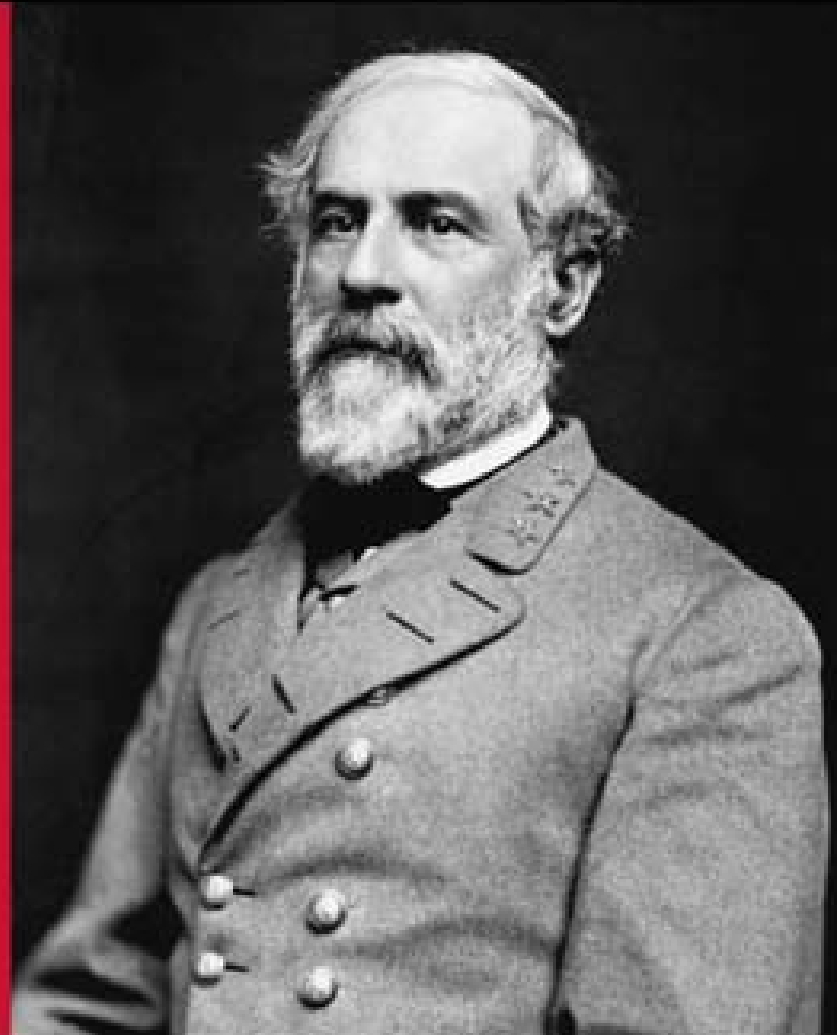

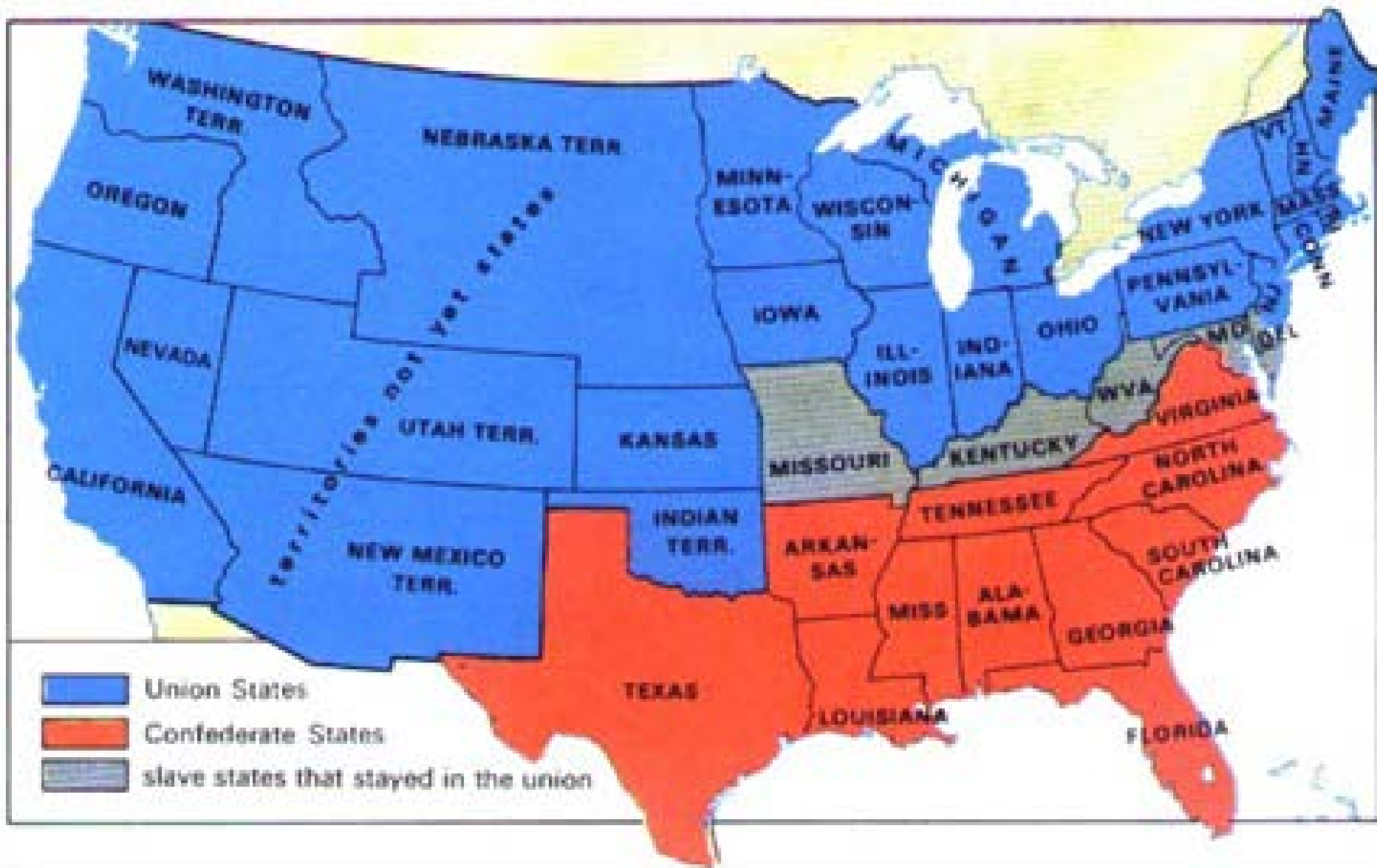
