HARTFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY PARTNERS WITH HARTFORD'S LITERART INTEGRATED TRAILBLAZERS FOR SEVENTH ANNUAL BOOK FESTIVAL

Saturday, September 27, 9:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

[HARTFORD, CT]— Hartford Public Library (HPL), in partnership with Hartford's Literary Integrated Trailblazers (Hartford's L.I.T. / H.L.I.T.), will host the 7th Annual Hartford Book Festival on Saturday, September 27, at Hartford Public Library's Downtown Library, 500 Main Street, Hartford, and a virtual writing festival on Sunday, September 28. This year's theme is "Literary Art Aligned in 2025."

The free two-day event celebrates community through literature and art, featuring live stage performances, open mics, workshops, panel discussions, family activities, author highlights, raffles, awards, and book giveaways. Families can enjoy the Lit Kiddie Parade (10:45-11:10 a.m.), where children dress as favorite book characters and parade through the Library. A book drive and giveaway will provide new and gently used books to children.

Highlights include a Poet Laureate Panel with Antoinette Brim Bell, Atom Rush, Frederick Douglass Knowles, and Sharmont Little; Voices of OUT, Barbara McClane's storytelling and photography project; the Kemet Cartoon Workshop with nationally recognized artist Joe Young; Nzima Hutchings's workshop Whispers and Shadows: Exploring Eerie Lyrical Literary Art; and Sa'id Abdush Shakur's presentation The Power of Transformation in Story: Honoring Malcolm X.

Special recognitions include the Trailblazer Award 2025, presented to Sharmont Influence Little, and the HoneyWata Award to Shanna T. Melton, as well as performances by Jason Jahsun Dorsey. Featured authors include youth writer Bella'Rae K. Robinson (*What's Inside*) and Alphonso McGriff III (*Roots of a Tree*).

Day Two: HLIT Writing Room (Virtual, Sunday, September 28, 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) Workshops include Brass Lips and Braided Verse: Contrapuntal Poetry and Gathering, Renaming and Blooming: The Art of Lyrical Writing led by Nzima Hutchings, and Ancestors and Elders: A Look Back at Lessons with T'challa Williams. Poet Laureate Clare Rossini will present readings and insights.





The festival closes with An Evening of Poetical Musings on Sunday, September 28, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. at 30 Bartholomew Street, Hartford. The evening features Paint and Poetry, live performances, open mic, and vendors.
