HARTFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY'S PARK STREET LIBRARY @ THE LYRIC NOW OPEN SUNDAYS

(Hartford, CT)—Hartford Public Library (HPL) is happy to announce that Sunday hours are back. Park Street Library @ the Lyric, 603 Park Street, Hartford, will now be open Sundays through May 2025 from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.

The two-story, 13,000-square-foot Library is in the Frog Hollow neighborhood of Hartford. It includes a 3,000-square-foot reading room, a 1,200-square-foot children's room, and the largest Spanish collection in the HPL system. On the Library's second floor, visitors can access a learning lab, a conference room, and a spacious 2,000-square-foot community room. This multipurpose area can accommodate over 150 people and is suitable for various gatherings such as meetings, lectures, events, and performances.
