HARTFORD PUBLIC LIBRARY ANNOUNCED TODAY THE PUBLIC LAUNCH OF THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN. RESTORE, RENEW, AND REIMAGINE

(Hartford, CT) – Today, Hartford Public Library (HPL) President and CEO Bridget E. Quinn was joined by major donors, Speaker of the House Matt Ritter, and Mayor Arunan Arulampalam for a milestone celebration to officially announce the public launch of the capital campaign, *Restore, Renew, and Reimagine*.

Restore, Renew, and Reimagine is a re-envisioning of HPL's Downtown Library. This transformation reflects the resilience, creativity, and aspirations of the city it serves. More than just a building renovation, the campaign is about rethinking what a public library can be in the 21st century - focusing on innovation, access, and opportunity for all. *The Restore, Renew, and Reimagine* campaign is an investment in Hartford's future, creating dynamic spaces where all are empowered to learn, create, and connect.

The successful completion of Phase 1—prompted by the catastrophic flood in 2022—restored many public areas of the Downtown Library, which have been open to the public since fall 2024. Phase 2 of this comprehensive renovation will further modernize the historic Downtown Library. Key improvements include upgraded technology infrastructure, flexible community spaces, expanded program areas, and enhanced accessibility features. The campaign will help create a 21st-century library that stands as Hartford's premier hub for learning, innovation, and civic engagement.

Phase 2 of the project is estimated at \$12.5 million. The State of Connecticut has committed \$5 million toward this cost. The campaign's goal is to raise an additional \$5 million, and thanks to the generous support of local foundations, businesses, and individual donors during the quiet phase, we have already secured \$4,367,900. This strong early momentum reflects the community's belief in the transformative vision of the *Restore, Renew, and Reimagine* campaign—and paves the way for even broader public support as we shape the future of Hartford Public Library together.

Governor Ned Lamont said, "The Hartford Public Library provides an amazing service to the residents of our capital city, especially our youths, and I am glad that the state is able to support the city with this grant that will be used to help the library strengthen its resources and provide positive impacts for many years to come."



Bridget E. Quinn, HPL President and CEO, said, "Today, we are ushering in a new chapter for our city by launching our campaign to the public. We are inviting our community to envision bigger dreams and to collaborate with us in constructing a stronger, more connected, and more empowered, inclusive community."

Speaker of the House Matt Ritter said, "Hartford Public Library is more than a City institution – It is part of the story that makes the City of Hartford so special. The launch of the Restore, Renew, and Reimagine is the next chapter in an amazing saga."

Mayor Arunan Arulampalam said, "Hartford Public Library is a cornerstone of our city, providing access to knowledge, technology, and community resources that uplift every neighborhood. My family visits regularly, and I've seen firsthand how the library creates a welcoming space for connection, curiosity, and learning. The launch of the *Restore, Renew, and Reimagine* campaign is a vital investment in Hartford's future, strengthening a place where all residents can grow, feel a sense of belonging, and thrive."
