The parade continued around the block, through Burr Mall, and back to the Downtown Library patio.

After the parade, there was a performance by the Hartford Proud Drill, Drum and Dance team, and remarks from Bridget E. Quinn, HPL President & CEO, and Dr. Leslie Torres-Rodriguez, HPS Superintendent. There was also face painting, ice cream, community partners, henna tattoos, balloon twisting, a Pride café, the Children's Museum StarLab, and more.
