

Youth and Family Outreach Services Librarian Full Time

The Youth & Family Outreach Services Librarian is responsible for collection development, programming, reference, reader's advisory, targeting outreach for children and families from birth through age 12, coordinating outside programming system-wide, collaborating with the Library on Wheels team, and helping with Teen Services as needed. This position works closely with the Youth & Family Services Manager to plan and implement strategies for improving delivery of youth services throughout the Library system. Serves as a Manager in Charge when needed. Orders and promotes children's materials of all kinds. Promotes delivery and promotion of youth programs. Creates and conducts tours and bibliographic instruction for children, their caregivers, and teachers through our Boundless partnership with Hartford Public Schools. Provides outreach to youth-serving agencies, schools, and organizations; and assists in writing and implementing grants.

RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

Programming, Collaboration, Outreach

- Provides up to 50% of the Downtown location's children's programming.
- Plans, implements and evaluates library programs and services which fulfill the diverse educational, recreational and personal needs of local youth and their families.
- Coordinates with outside programmers to deliver programming system-wide
- Instructs youth and caregivers in information gathering, research skills and digital literacy skills.
- Ensures youth customers who visit the branch are engaged in social and academic experiences.
- Creates and conducts tours and bibliographic instruction for the public and community stakeholders.
- Tracks statistics for programming and delivers reports as needed. Assists with the development and implementation of grant funded programming.
- Daily time on the Children's Department reference desk as assigned.

Outreach, Partnerships, and Collaboration

- Outreaches to public and private schools, parent groups, community groups, other youth agencies, and funders to provide programs and instruction for children and adults.
- Serves as liaison to assigned schools under the Boundless partnership with Hartford Public Schools.
- Trains other Youth Service Staff in new and innovative content, as well as helping to onboard new hires.
- Collaborates with Library on Wheels staff to ensure youth service delivery is uniform across the system.

Customer Service

- Provides prompt, welcoming, courteous and direct assistance to all customers with basic information regarding the use of library materials, equipment, and services.
- Checks items in and out, creates library cards, and process materials as needed.
- Provides reference services and readers' advisory.

- Develops relationships with customers who frequent the branch.
- Positively reflects Hartford Public Library's mission, vision, and values to staff and the public.

Collection Development

- Orders children's materials in a variety of formats for the Children's Department in conjunction with the Youth and Family Services Manager.
- Provides readers advisory.

Other duties as assigned.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE/QUALIFICATIONS:

- Master's Degree in Library Science or Library Information Science from an accredited institution.
- 2 to 4 years of experience, with the ability to work with diverse populations.
- Experience creating and conducting children's programming, with an emphasis on Storytime and STEM.
- Knowledge of library best practices.
- Bilingual language skills are desirable.
- Strong commitment to working in a team environment is required.
- Required proficiency in Microsoft Office suite and Google products.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with individuals and groups, both professional and non-professional, co-workers, management personnel, the public and others.
- Strong written and verbal communication, listening, organization and priority setting skills.
- Strong public relations skills.
- Ability to work in a fast-paced environment and juggle multiple priorities.
- Ability to think quickly, assess a situation and make a sound decision.
- Ability to create clear and concise reports, and to deliver them orally to a wide variety of audiences.
