## High-Caliber Talent Fills the Lineup for Hartford Public Library's 2015 Baby Grand Jazz Series

Kaman Charitable Foundation, a free, 16-week concert series held each Sunday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. in the Library's Downtown Atrium. This year's lineup comprises world-class regional and local talent and a variety of jazz styles and cultures, ranging in size from intimate duos to full bands.

Presented in partnership with the Hartford Jazz Society and WWUH 91.3 F.M., Baby Grand Jazz is a unique, highly-anticipated annual event that magnifies the rich history of jazz in Hartford.
