Library's Baby Grand Jazz Series Kickoff Breaks Attendance Records

HARTFORD, Connecticut (January 7, 2014) – **The 11th season of Hartford Public Library's widely popular Baby Grand Jazz Series kicked off Sunday, January 5** with a record-breaking appearance by Meg Okura and the Pan Asian Chamber Jazz Ensemble, who performed a unique and lively set for **a crowd of 600 jazz fans, music aficionados, and library patrons.**

"We're so happy to be here, because we love libraries," said violin virtuoso Okura. "Hartford is so fortunate to have such a wonderful resource. The audience members were so enthusiastic, and it's so wonderful that you make jazz so exciting for the community!"

The Kitchen, usually closed on weekends, will be open 2:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. Sunday afternoons through January with the potential to extend Sunday hours through the end of the series.
