SPRING 2012 ONE BOOK ONE HARTFORD SELECTION

Hartford, Connecticut (March 20, 2012) — Hartford Public Library is proud to announce that the short story collection *I Am an Emotional Creature* by Eve Ensler is the latest selection for Hartford's citywide book club, **One Book One Hartford**.

In this daring book, internationally acclaimed author and playwright Eve Ensler offers fictional monologues and stories inspired by girls around the globe. Fierce, tender, and smart, *I Am an Emotional Creature* is a celebration of the authentic voice inside every girl and an inspiring call to action for girls everywhere to speak up, follow their dreams, and become

the women they were always meant to be.

"I am thrilled that **One Book One Hartford** has chosen *I am an Emotional Creature* and will be focusing attention on the situation of girls both at home and around the world. It is my hope that this book will lead to the liberation of the greatest resource on the planet --girls and girl energy," said Eve Ensler.

Activist, artist, author, Eve Ensler has become a feminist icon and a fearless advocate on behalf of women throughout the world. Since her boundary-shattering play *The Vagina Monologues* lifted the silence on women discussing their bodies and sexuality, Eve has taken her message far beyond the confines of the theater. Her V-Day organization is now a global entity stopping violence and oppression against women while empowering "vagina warriors" to take control of their lives and communities.

"One Book One Hartford continues to bring residents from across the city together to celebrate the joy of exploring new worlds through reading," said Mayor Pedro Segarra. "*I Am an Emotional Creature* continues the rich and varied history of **One Book One Hartford**, and I look forward to joining the thousands of residents in reading it this spring."

- One Book One Hartford Community Forum: Violence Against Women's Health Issues (April 19, 5:30 p.m.) – a panel about women's access to and control over reproductive health care moderated by Jeannette deJesus, Deputy Commissioner, Public Health for the State of Connecticut. At the Downtown Library.
- Hartbeat Ensemble presents *I Am an Emotional Creature* (May 1, 6:00 p.m.) Readings based on the book followed by audience discussion. At the Downtown Library

Throughout its history, Hartford Public Library has always encouraged people of all ages to make reading a priority. **One Book One Hartford** began in the fall of 2002, to encourage all citizens to read the same book at the same time, and discuss a great piece of literature with friends and neighbors.
