The Stars Shined for Hartford Public Library's One Big Summer Night Gala

Hartford, Connecticut (July 16, 2012) — Hartford Public Library and nearly 630 of its supporters, including State and local government leaders, business executives, media and literary celebrities, came together for the Library's spectacular annual gala, *One Big nearly Summer Night* at the Connecticut Convention Center in Hartford on June 12. The event, sponsored by Connecticut Light & Power and chaired by Lieutenant Governor Nancy Wyman, raised nearly \$128,000 to support high quality public education for all ages.

Highlights of the event included pre-event cocktail receptions sponsored by **The Hartford and First Niagara**, a live auction sponsored by the **Travelers**, a silent auction, a sumptuous meal, and performances by Ed Fast and Christine Dixon-Smith (Sistah Nandi) and the Sankofa Ensemble.

Matt Poland, the Library's chief executive officer, launched a fundraising campaign for *Itty Bitty City*, an interactive learning and discovery play space for Hartford youth and

their parents. \$27,000 was raised in support of this project that focuses on early literacy for children ages birth to five.

Of the event, **Lt. Governor Wyman** said, "This Library is not just a building filled with books. It is a living, breathing and growing part of the lifeblood of this community that is enriching the lives and the futures of so many – young, old and in-between. I was proud to be Honorary Chair of this wonderful gala, and even prouder that our Capital city is home to such an exceptional place of learning – and of doing. And Hartford Public Library, a place like no other, is among the best in the nation."
