Hartford Public Library Partners with Connecticut Science Center To Promote Free Connecticut Science Center Admission for Hartford Residents During August

The Travelers Companies, Inc. provides funding to bring back popular program

Hartford, CT (July 31, 2014) – The Hartford Public Library is once again partnering with the Connecticut Science Center to make science learning and summer fun opportunities available to all Hartford residents this summer. Thanks to funding provided by The Travelers Companies, Inc., all city of Hartford residents will have access to free General Admission to the Science Center in Downtown Hartford during the entire month of August, by picking up free Science Center passes at any Hartford Public Library branch.

"The Library is delighted to participate in this fantastic opportunity for our residents," said Matthew K. Poland, the Library's chief executive officer. "The Connecticut Science Center is a remarkable place for families to spend time together having fun and learning at the same time. We hope even more people participate this year."

The popular program, inspired by Mayor Pedro E. Segarra, is being brought back by the Connecticut Science Center after overwhelming success over the past 3 years. Segarra had hoped to "connect all of our residents, especially our youth, with the best assets and opportunities that our community has to offer." Last year, more than 3,500 Hartford residents took advantage of the program by visiting the Science Center.

To encourage Hartford residents to visit the Hartford Public Library, Free Connecticut Science Center admission is only available through passes received at Hartford Public Library branches.

Passes will be awarded to residents providing library staff with proof of residency, which may include current driver's license, library card or recently received U.S. mail showing current name and address. Residents will need to show proof of current Hartford residency at the library location *and* at the Connecticut Science Center. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Movie tickets are not included in the coupon. Certain restrictions apply.

General Admission includes all day access to all of the Science Center's hands-on exhibits including the two thrilling traveling exhibits, *Mindbender Mansion*, presented by Travelers, *and The Adventures of Mr. Potato Head*, presented locally by Citizens Bank. Both exhibits are on display through September 1 in the Saint Francis *Care* Traveling Exhibit Gallery on Level 4 of the Science Center.
